Achievement and Conversion

The average child should achieve:

- **Level 2b or better at age seven**
- **Level 4 or better at age eleven**
- **Level 5 or better at age fourteen**

- **Providing attendance is at 90% or better**



Achievement and Conversion

In GCSE the average child should achieve 5+*A-C grades if:

- They achieved level 4 or better in En and Ma at age eleven**
- Level 5 or better in En, Ma and Sc at age fourteen**
- Complete their GCSE coursework and have 90% or better attendance**

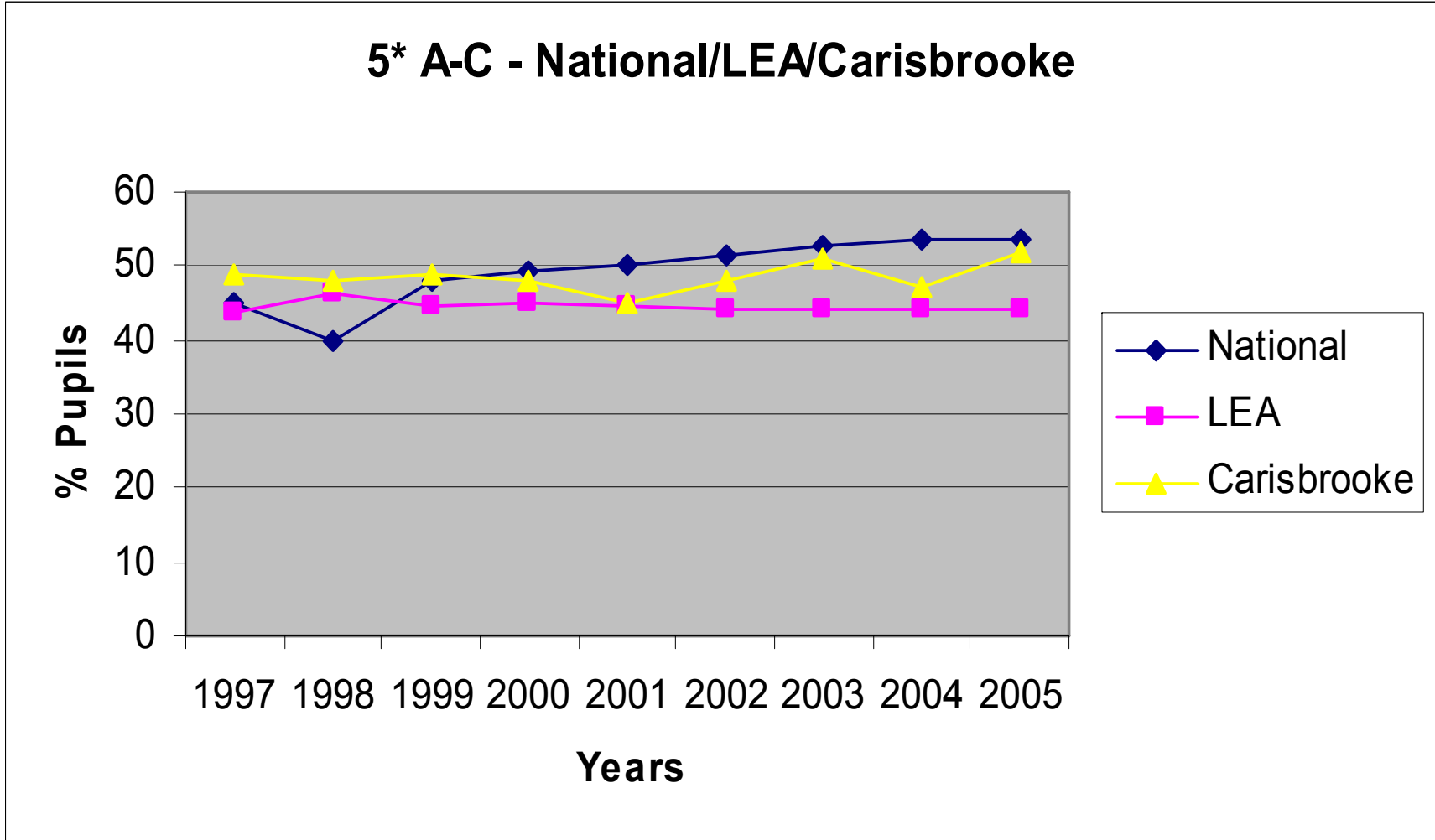

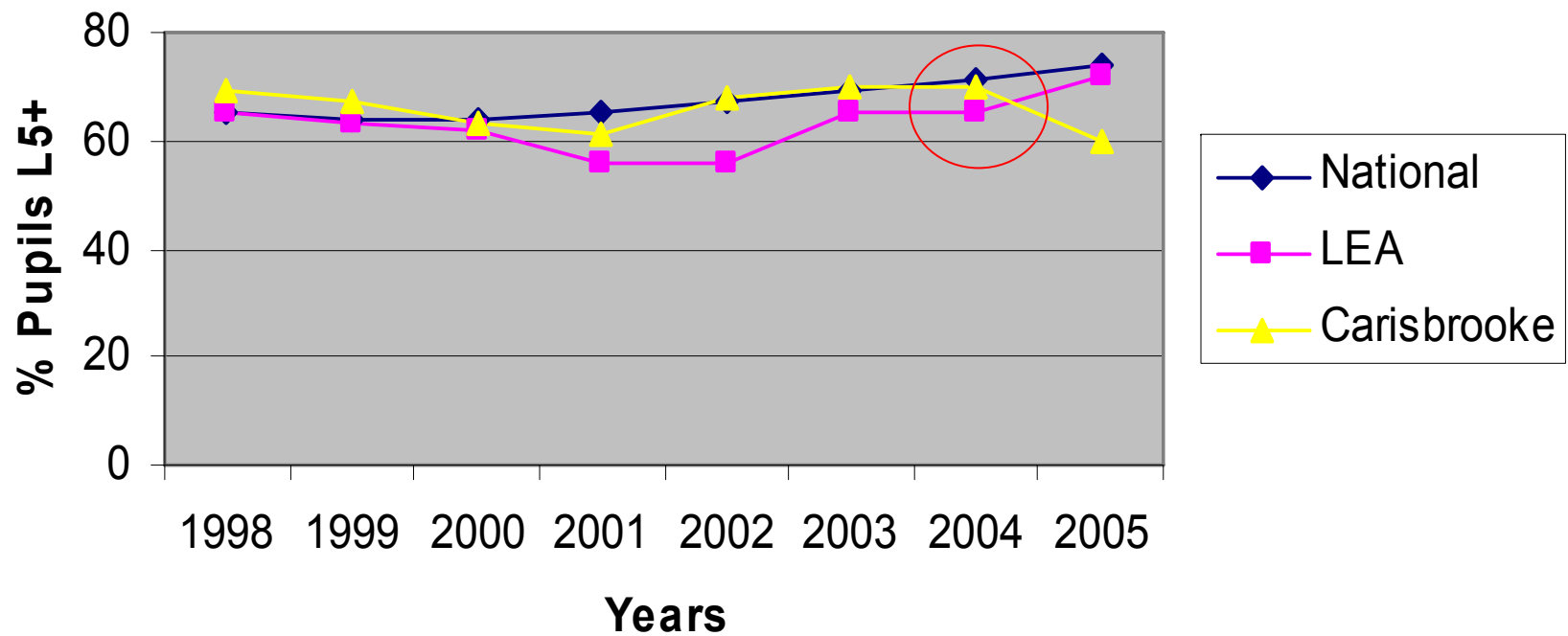

Performance above national and that of the Island in most areas. However, some individual school weakness in extension to L3+ in all areas.

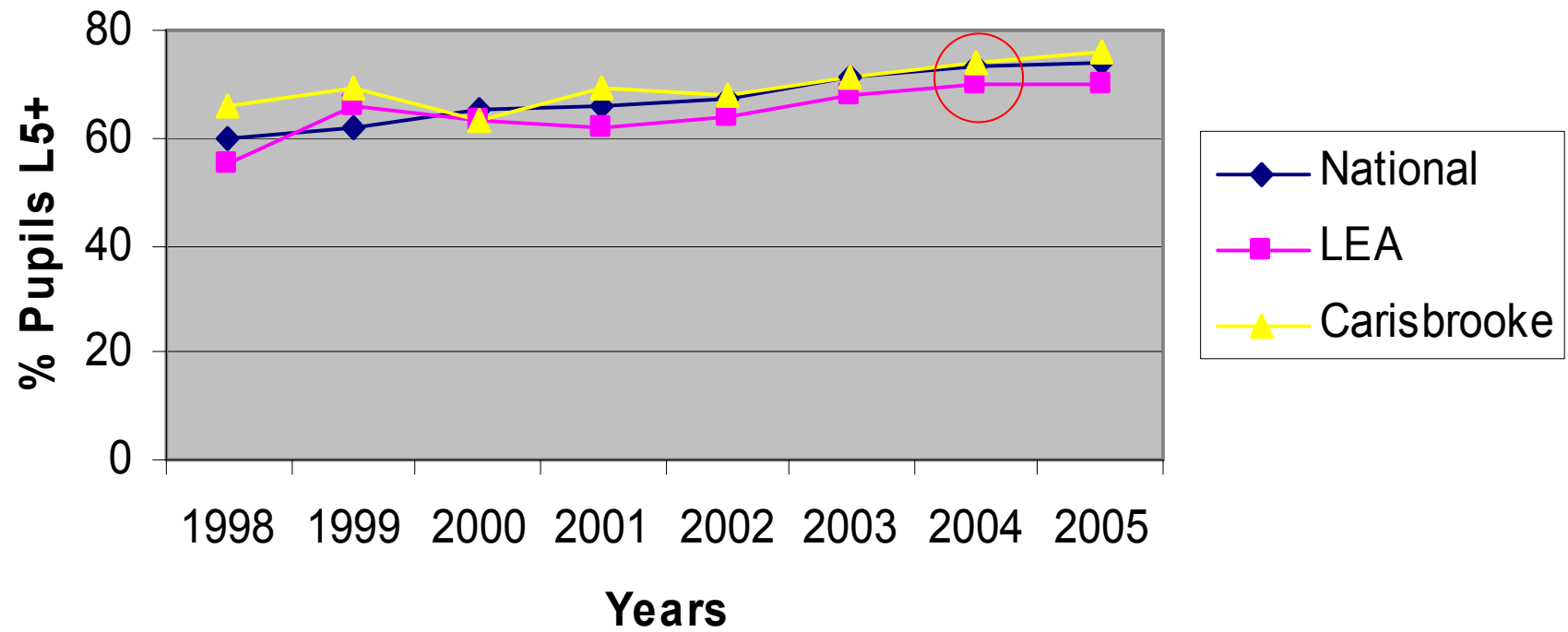

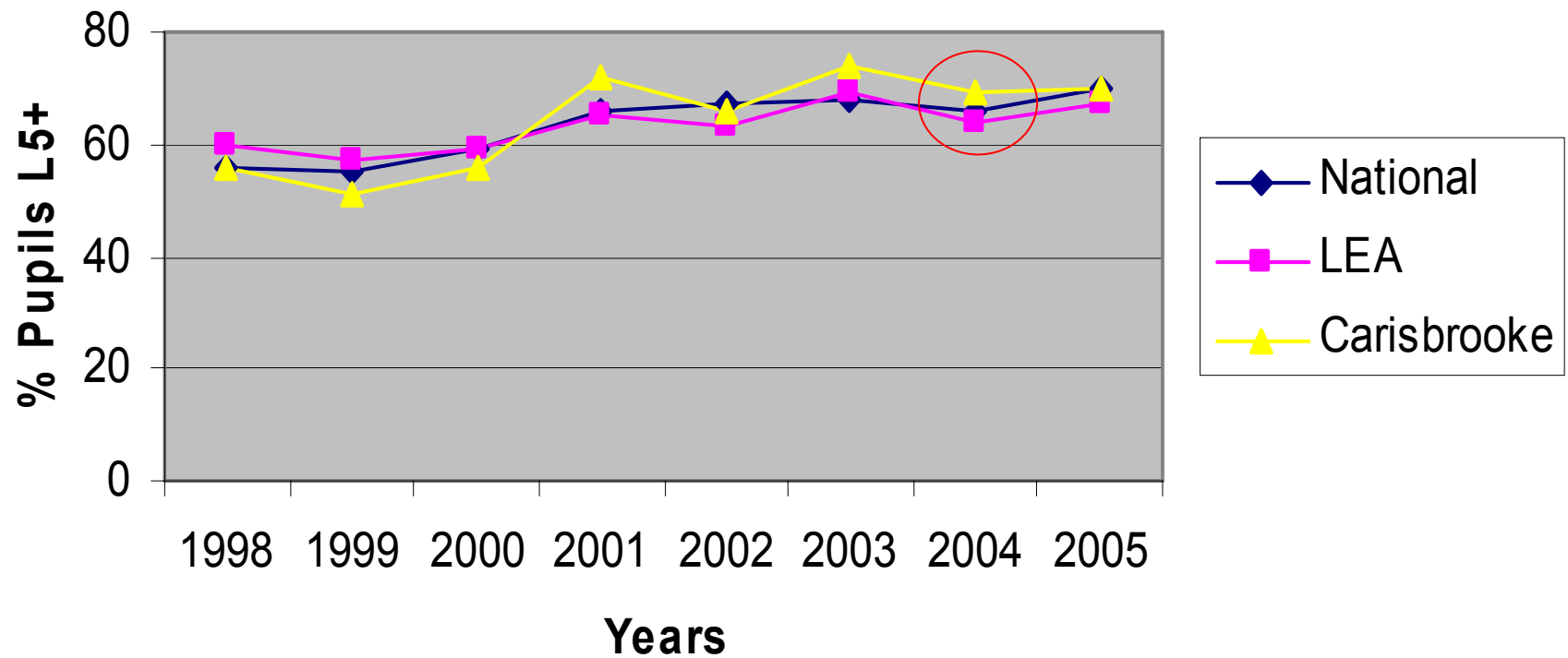
KS3 English Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



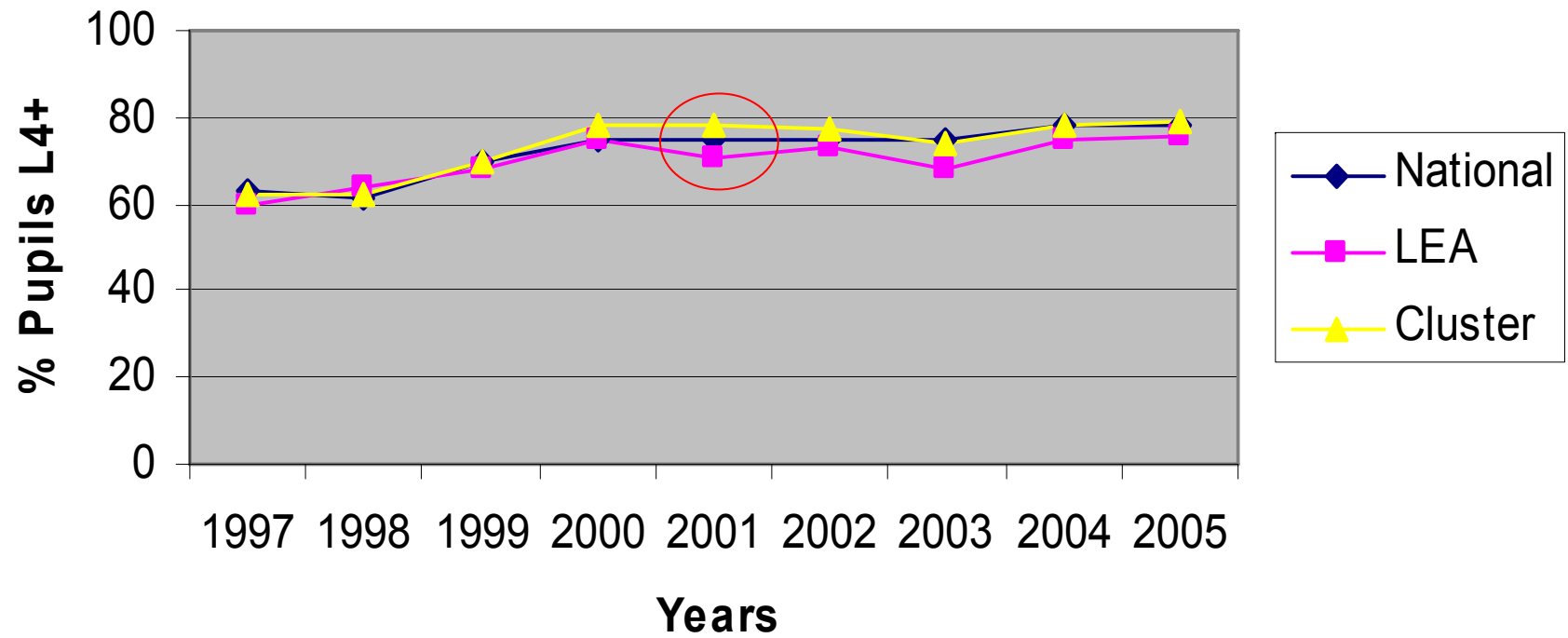
KS3 Mathematics Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



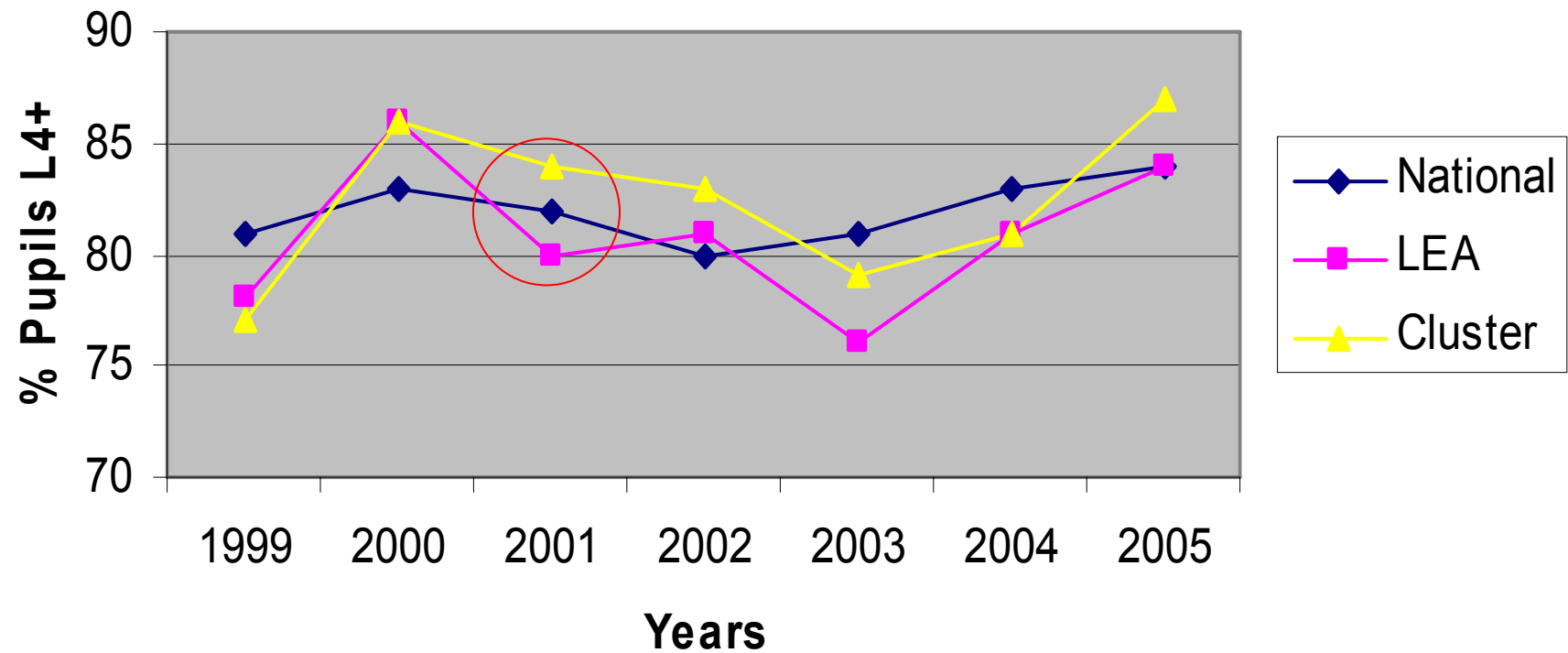
KS3 Science Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



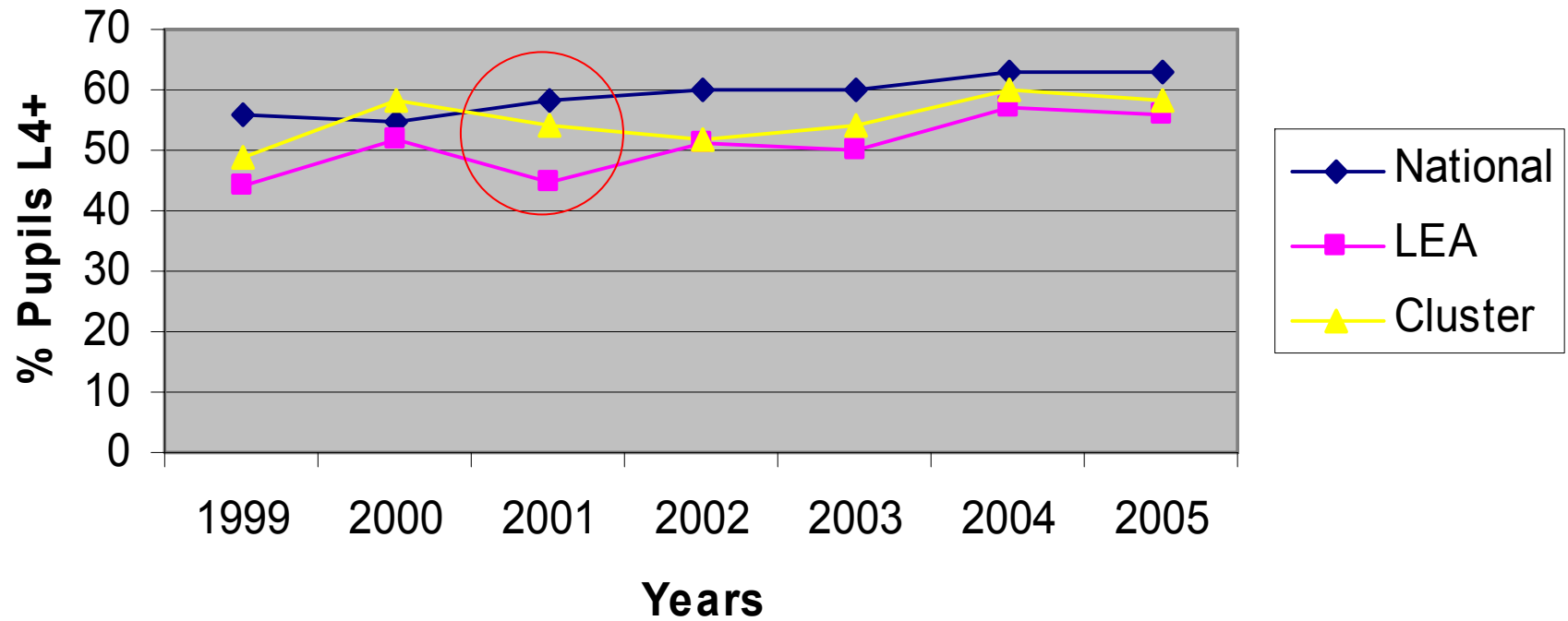
KS2 English Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



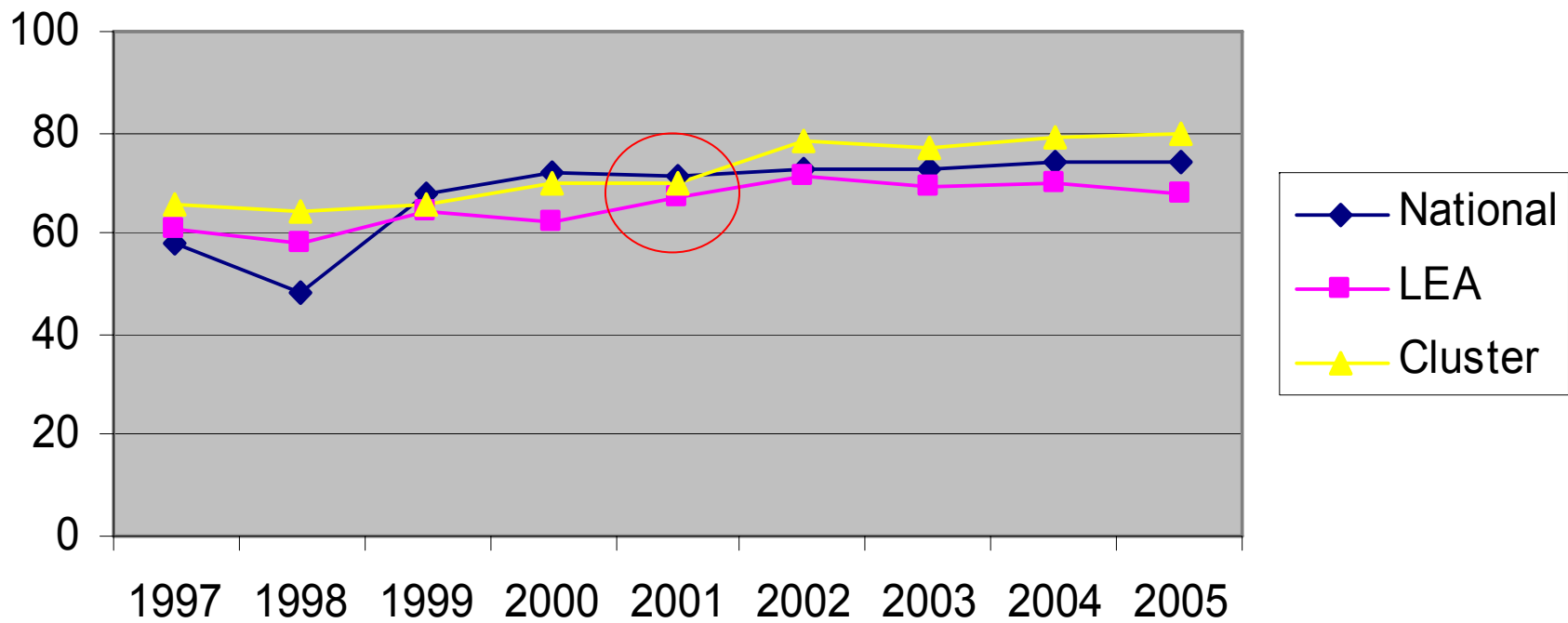
KS2 Reading Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



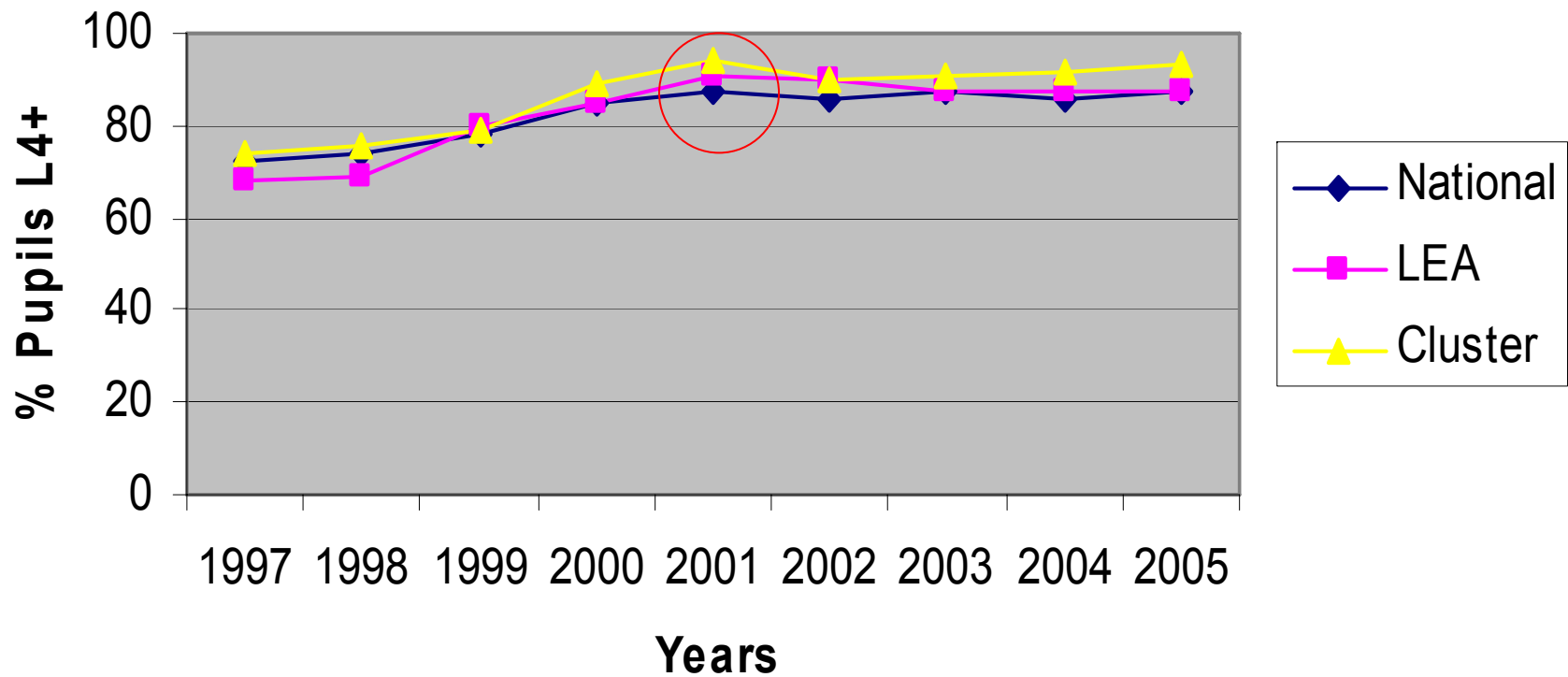
KS2 Writing Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster



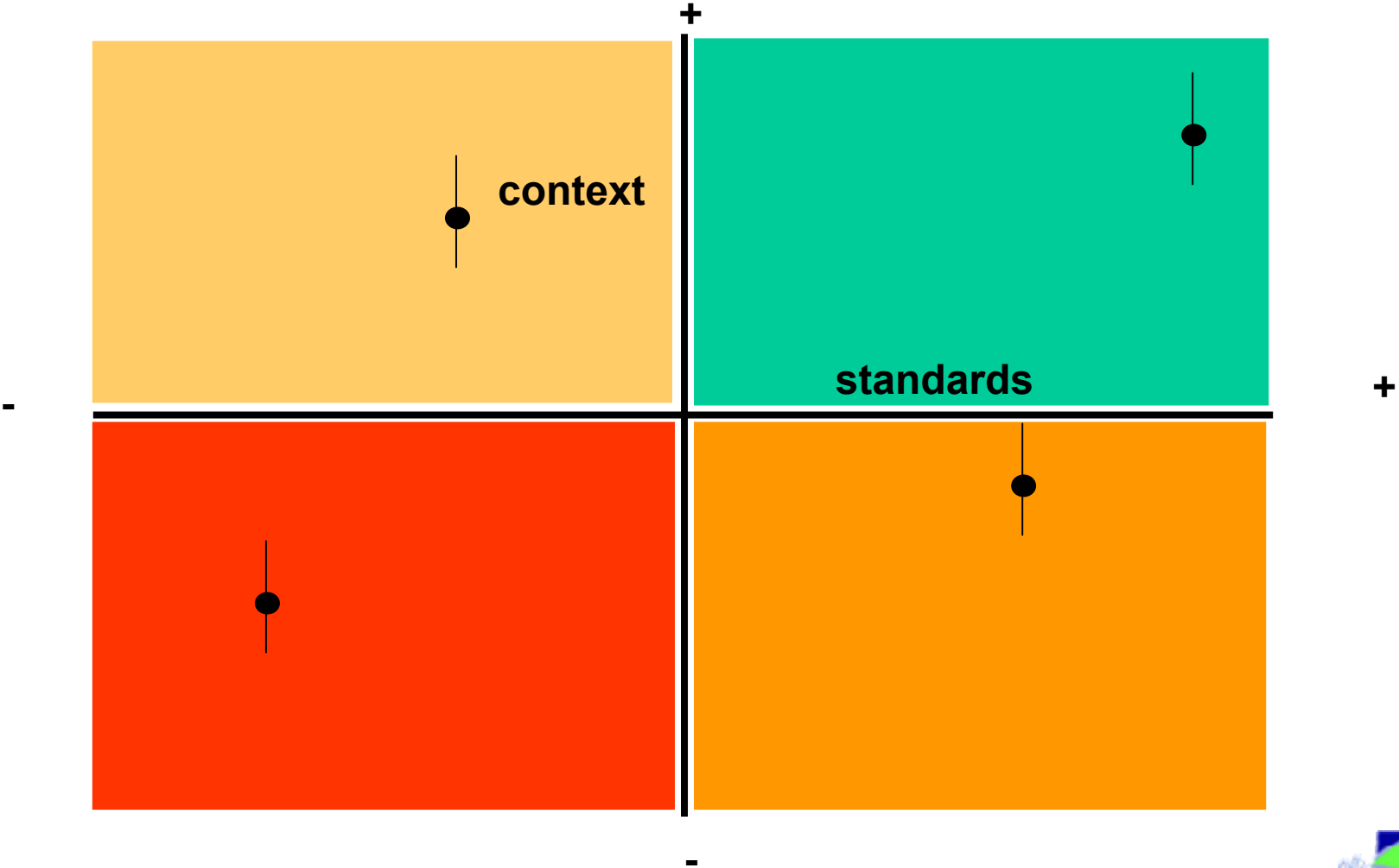
KS2 Mathematics Trend - National/LEA/Carisbrooke Cluster
